Marcus E. Renfrow, Mayor called the meeting to order, and Rick Watson led in prayer. Then followed the Pledge of Allegiance.

It was moved by Mayor Pro Tem Conner that the minutes of prior meetings, copies of which were emailed to each council member prior to the meeting, be approved as written. The motion was seconded by Council Member Wright and carried.

Justin Sittig, City Clerk, gave the monthly Administration Department report.

Bills for the month of May 2022 were approved and payment authorized upon a motion by Council Member Loyd seconded by Council Member Wright and carried.

Mayor Renfrow updated the governing authority on pending grants and projects.

Terry Vice, Director of Public Works, provided his monthly public works report, and spoke about bids which had been received for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Chief Chris Vice was not present to give monthly Fire Department report.

Chief of Police Scott Spell gave monthly Police Department report.

Mayor Renfrow indicated the Council needed to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel matters regarding Officer David Lyons. Council Member Stanley made a motion to enter into Executive Session. The motion was seconded by Council Member Wright and carried.
